## Washington Attorney Had Been Suffering From Heart Attacks for Several Years

John Raymond Adams, 54 years old, member of the bar and prominent in fraternal circles, was found dead alongside his automobile parked at the curb on Massachusetts avenue between First and Second streets northeast about 12:15 o'clock this morning by Timothy Regan of 1241 B street southeast. Dr. J. Rogers Young, member of the staff of Casualty Hospital, responded to an emergency call, examined the body and pronounced life extinct.

Mr. Adams had been a sufferer from heart attacks the past six years and had been worried since the death of Capt. William E. Luckett, his brother-in-law, noted Potomac pilot, a short time ago. It is believed he stopped his automobile when he realized he was about to have an attack and fell to the street, dying before aid came.

Mr. Adams, a native of this city, was unmarried, and lived with his mother, Mrs. M.E. Adams, at 214 South Carolina avenue southeast, his father, John R. Adams, having died 18 years ago. He was a member of New Jerusalem Lodge of Masons, was a Scottish Rite Mason, Shriner and member of Washington Lodge of Elks. Funeral services will be held Monday and interment will be in Congressional Cemetery.

## Attorney Who Died in His Auto Saturday of Heart Attack Buried in Congressional Cemetery

Funeral services for J.
