Coroner W.C. Orr, Commonwealth's Attorney Cecil Connor and Sheriff T.W. Edwards were called to Leithton, Loudoun County, yesterday afternoon to hold an inquest over the body of George W. Ashton, a plumber of Washington, D.C. which was found near the gate of D.C. Sands yesterday morning. It was found that Ashton, who had been working at the home of Mr. Murphy, near Leithton, had fallen in Goose creek, while fishing, and had lain down and slept near the gate of Mr. Sands. Death was due to exposure, it was decided by the coroner. Ashton was about forty-six years old, and, it is said, had a family residing in Washington. The body was taken there for burial.
