Mrs. Hanna Bates Dies at Age of 90

Widow of Former Jeweler Came to Capital as Bride in 1864

Mrs. Hannah C. Bates, 90, died yesterday at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Eva M. Clark, 1314 Pennsylvania avenue southeast, after an illness of six months. She was a resident of Washington for 70 years, coming here as the bride of James G. Bates in 1864. Mr. Bates, who died in 1924, operated a jewelry shop in the Southeast section, and their home at 668 Pennsylvania avenue southeast was one of the first homes in that section of the city.
