Mrs. Linnie B Bates, 77, of 5712 Colorado avenue, wife of William C. Bates, died Monday in Garfield Hospital after a short illness.

Funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. tomorrow at Chambers' funeral home, 1400 Chapin street. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.

A native of Smithburg, Md., Mrs. Bates was the daughter of Capt. Adam Martin of the Union Army, who organized a company of volunteers at Hagerstown, Md. He was killed in the battle of Antietam.

Mrs. Bates had been a resident of this city for 55 years. Her husband is a retired employe of Woodward & Lothrop.

Besides her husband she is survived by a sister, Mrs. Annie E. Wood of Hagerstown.

Mrs. Bates Dies; District Resident

Mrs. William C. Bates, 77, daughter of a Union Army captain and District resident more than half a century, died Monday at Garfield Hospital.

Born at Smithfield, Md., Mrs. Bates moved to Hagerstown, Md., when a small girl. Her father, Capt. Adam Martin, at the outbreak of the Civil War formed a company of volunteers at Hagerstown. He was killed a year later at the Battle of Antietam.

Fifty-five years ago she moved to Washington where she married William C. Bates. Her husband is a retired employe of the Woodward & Lothrop Co. They had no children.

Funeral services will be held tomorrow at 10 a.m. from the W.W. Chambers funeral home. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery."
