Walter Henry Beal Jr., a retired architect at the Defense Department and a retired colonel in the Army Reserve, died September 27 at Prince George's Hospital Center after a heart attack.

Mr. Beal, who lived in Mitchellville, was a Washington native. He graduated from Central High School and Virginia Polytechnic Institute.
