AAA Typist Killed as 'Cycle Hits Safety Island on Route 1

A Washington woman died Monday in a Fredericksburg, Va., hospital of injuries received in a motorcycle accident near there early Sunday.

She was Mrs. Mary Adelaide Bedford, 20, of 5926 13th pl. nw. Her companion, John T. White, jr., of 3500 Highwood dr. se., was said to have sustained a broken collar bone but has been released from the hospital.

The accident occurred about 1 a.m. Sunday when the motorcycle operated by White struck a safety island on Route 1 near Fredericksburg, skidded and overturned.

Members of Mrs. Bedford's family said she and White were on their way to Richmond to watch motorcycle races when the accident occurred.

White is slated to appear at a Spotsylvania County Trial Justice Court hearing October 21 on a reckless driving charge.

A native of Washington, Mrs. Bedford attended public schools here. She was employed by the American Automobile Association as a secretary.

She and her husband, Walter Bedford, of New Orleans, were estranged. They have one child, John, 2, who has been hospitalized here since birth with a gland disease.

Mrs. Bedford is also survived by her mother, Mrs. Carline Ratrie, a teacher at Capitol Heights, Md. Elementary school, and two sisters, Mrs. Alice Ann Luly and Miss Myrna Ratrie, all of the 12th pl. address.
