Death of Dr. Bevier

An Old Resident of Washington Passes Away

William D. Bevier, M.D., aged eighty two years, died yesterday evening at the home of his daughter, Mrs. S.E. Matlock, 1420 11th street northwest. Dr. Bevier was born in Ulster county, N.Y., April 1, 1823. His ancestors were French Huguenots, having come to this country at an early day and exerted a controlling influence in that part of the state. After his graduation in medicine Dr. Bevier practiced his profession in his native county for twenty years. A short time before the beginning of the civil war he removed with his family to the vicinity of Manassas, Va., where they were living at the time of the battle of Manassas. He was in position to give aid and comfort to the soldiers of the Union army which were encamped at that point during the first part of the war.

Leaving Virginia in 1863, he returned to Ulster county, N.Y., where he resumed the practice of medicine. About twenty years ago he came to this city and opened an office as consulting physician. His mind was clear and his physical strength good until recently.

His remains will be interred in Congressional cemetery tomorrow. The funeral services will be held at the home of his daughter at 2:30 p.m.
