Mrs. S.A. Boswell Dies

Descendant of British Royalty Succumbs to Cerebral Hemorrhage

Mrs. Sallie Amelia Boswell, widow of Robert Stratton Boswell, who was well known for many years in the District courts, and the granddaughter of Maj. Amon Woodward of this city and Maryland, died suddenly yesterday morning at her apartment, at the Berkshire, on Chapin street. Her death was caused by cerebral hemorrhage, which developed suddenly after her return from a shopping tour Friday. It is thought that a recent fall may have caused the hemorrhage. She was in her sixty-sixth year.

Mrs. Boswell was born in California, when her father, Amon Woodward, jr., then in the Navy, was stationed there. Her mother before marriage was Eliza Chatten of England. When a young child Mrs. Boswell moved to Washington, where she spent the greater part of her life. She was a direct descendant of Lady Ann Perrott of the royal family of England.

Surviving her are three daughters, Mrs. Anna Exner Rush, Mrs. Frank Morrison and Miss Gretna Perrott Boswell; and a son, Robert Arthur Boswell, a patent attorney of this city. Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock at her late residence. Rev. George F. Dudley will officiate. Interment will be in Glenwood cemetery.
