Dr. Benton Bradford, Ex-Head of District Dental Society, Dies

Dr. Fenton Bradford, past president of the District Dental Society and native of Washington, died last night at his home in the LaSalle Apartments, 1028 Connecticut avenue N.W.

Educated in the District public schools, he received his degree in dentistry from George Washington University in 1898. He had practiced dentistry here for many years with offices in the LaSalle Apartments.

He was the son of May Gunnell Bradford and Frederick G.H. Bradford, who served as a surgeon in the Northern Army during the Civil War. He also was descended from William Bradford, second governor of Plymouth Colony, and Charles Broadwater, a vestryman with George Washington at Christ Church, Alexandria, Va.

Dr. Bradford belonged to the American Dental Association and the Washington Philatelic Society. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Lela Cheney Bradford.

Funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. Wednesday at Gawler's funeral home, with the Rev. Harold V.O. Lounsbury of the Episcopal City Missions of the Diocese of Washington and a personal friend of the family, officiating. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.
