Daughter of Missionary, 87, Lived in Washington 60 Years

Mrs. Jane Elizabeth Bradley, 87 years old, a resident of Washington for more than 60 years, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. J. Harry Cunningham, 214 East Thornapple street, Chevy Chase, Md., yesterday. She had been ill about a week following a paralytic stroke.

Mrs. Bradley was born in Batavia, Java, where her father, the late Rev. William T. VanDoren, was a missionary. She has resided here since 1865. Mrs. Cunningham is her only survivor.
