A Woman Burned to Death

Saturday afternoon, Mrs. Elizabeth Brady, residing on 1st street east, while intoxicated fell on a cooking stove and her dress taking fire she was burned to death before assistance could be rendered. She was alone at the time, and a carpenter, working on a house nearby noticed smoke issuing from the windows and broke open the door and found the body lying on the floor dead with the head and breast frightfully burned. The coroner was notified and held an inquest yesterday morning. The jury returned a verdict that she came to her death at the place stated by reasons of being accidentally burned while under the influence of intoxicating drink.
