## **Funerals**

Yesterday afternoon, the funeral of the late Albert Brewer took place from the residence of his father, on the corner of 3d street and Massachusetts avenue, and was very largely attended by the members of the police force, the Odd Fellows and Masons, and the relatives and friends of the deceased. The services at the house were conducted by Rev. Dr. Hamilton, of Ryland (M.E.) Chapel. The corpse, in a beautiful coffin, on top of which was the regalia of the orders and two beautiful wreaths, was borne to the hearse by the pall-bearers—Capt. B.M. Reed and George E. Harwood, of St. John's Lodge of Masons; S.P. Robertson and R. Richards, of Metropolis Lodge of Odd Fellows, and W.H. Howes and S.B. Clements, of the police. The procession was formed as follows, and proceeded to the Congressional Cemetery, where the remains were interred with the services of the orders: Detachment of nearly 100 policemen under Lieut. Kelly, accompanied by Lieuts. Noonan, Eckloff and Gessford (fifty of whom were specially detailed); Metropolis Lodge, No. 16, I.O.O.F., marshaled by G.H. Fayman, headed by Heald's American Brass Band, led by J.P. Spanier; St. John's Lodge of Masons, marshaled by W.H. Orcutt, and headed by Heald's Washington Brass Band, led by I.A. Heald; carriages containing the relatives and friends of the deceased.
