Nathaniel Brewer Dies; Lived Here Fifty Years

Funeral to Be Held Tomorrow Afternoon at 2 O'Clock -- Born at Fairfax, Va.

Nathaniel Brewer, resident of Washington, and particularly of Capitol Hill for half a century, died at his home, 421 6th street southeast, yesterday. He was seventy-nine years old. Funeral services will be held at his late residence tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. C.M. Compher of the First M.P. Church officiating. Interment will be private.

Mr. Brewer was born at Fairfax, Va., in 1837, and came to Washington at the close of the civil war. He was engaged in the grain and feed business for thirty-five years, retiring about ten years ago. He was a brother of Charles J. Brewer, who was a member of Washington's old legislature, before the present system of government for the District was adopted, and of Nixon Brewer.

Mr. Brewer was a member of Harmony Lodge, No. 9, I.O.O.F., and of the First M.P. Church, to which he belonged for fifty years. He leaves four children, William J. Brewer, James F. Brewer, Mrs. Charles P. Begert and Mrs. Harry W. Chenoweth.
