Funeral services for Harry J. Brown, 71, Washington correspondent for Western newspapers for more than 50 years, will be held at 11:30 a.m. tomorrow in the Pumphrey funeral home, 7557 Wisconsin avenue, Bethesda. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.

Mr. Brown, a native of Washington, died Thursday, at his home, 6412 Ridgewood avenue, Chevy Chase, after a heart attack. Dean of the House and Senate press galleries, he had been a member of both for 52 years and was the senior member in point of service. He belonged to the Gridiron Club for 35 years and was its president in 1928.
