Walter Brownley Stricken At Home

Candy Company President, Here 35 Years, Dies Suddenly Following Heart Attack

Walter Brownley, president and treasurer of Brownley's, Incorporated candy store operators, died at his home, 1210 Massachusetts avenue, early this afternoon. He was stricken with a sudden heart attack, according to the members of the family.

Mr. Brownley had been in failing health for some time, relatives say, but had not been considered dangerously ill. He had, however, been confined to his home for some time, and, although up and around his apartment most of the time, had to stay in bed today, due to sickness.

Mr. Brownley, who was 53 years old, was a native of Charlottesville, Va., but had spent the greater part of his life in this city, having come here about 35 years ago.

He established the candy business here some 26 years ago. There are now two Brownley stores one at Thirteenth and F streets and the other at 1205 G street.

Mr. Brownley long had been interested in the Masonic fraternity and was a member of the New Jerusalem Lodge of Masons.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Emma Brownley, two brothers, Edward R. Brownley and W.C. Brownley, and a sister, Mrs. C.B. Bailey.
