### **Funeral Services Today For Charles C. Bruchie**

Funeral services for Charles Clayton Bruchie, 82, retired Treasury Department captain of the guard, were to be held at 2:30 p.m. today at the Chambers funeral home, 517 Eleventh street S.E., followed by burial in Congressional Cemetery.

Mr. Bruchie died Wednesday in the Soldiers' Home Hospital after a year's illness. He lived at 1782 Forty-first place S.E.

A Washington resident since 1895, he worked as an ordinance man at the Navy Yard before his employment at the Treasury. He retired from the Treasury post in 1937 after 20 years.

Born in Frederick County, Md., Mr. Bruchie served in the Army Signal Corps from 1891 until 1895. He was a member of the Masons and active in Woodmen of the World.

Surviving are two daughters, Mrs. Douglas Vandiver, 1811 Independence avenue S.E., and Mrs. William Moore of the Forty-first place address; a son, Charles J. Bruchie, 614 Emerson street N.W., and five grandchildren.
