Mrs. Ella Anne Burdine, 81, one of the early residents of Takoma Park, died yesterday at Garfield Hospital after an illness of four months.

Mrs. Burdine lived at 6603 Eastern Avenue, Takoma Park, with her son, Sergt. H. Burdine, of the Montgomery County police department. She had resided in Takoma Park for 41 years. She was a charter member of the auxiliary to William Redmond Post, Veterans of Foreign Wars, and also a member of the auxiliary to the Takoma Volunteer Fire Department.

Surviving are three other sons, Ward P. and Eugene D., of Takoma Park, and George C., of Washington. Funeral arrangements had not been completed last night.
