## Bureau Of Engraving Worker Held Suicide Coroner Issues Certificate in Death of Russell Burroughs Found Shot In Club

A certificate of suicide has been issued by Coroner A. Magruder MacDonald in the case of Russell Burroughs, 42-year-old plate printer at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, who shot himself through the head Friday night at the Social Oyster Club, 1251 Saratoga avenue northeast.

Burroughs, who lived at 1622 Newton street northeast, was found dead in a room on the second floor of the club. His body lay across a bed and the pistol he used to take his life was on the floor nearby.

Friends of Burroughs' said he appeared "moody" when he came to the club. Burroughs is survived by his widow, Mrs. Helen P. Burroughs.
