Death of Dr. Carpenter

Union Veteran and Trustee of District Reform School

Dr. John E. Carpenter died yesterday afternoon at his residence, 44 R street northeast. He had not been in good health for several years, but had been able to be about as usual until a week ago. He leaves a large circle of friends and acquaintances who held him in high respect. Funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the late residence.

Dr. Carpenter was a native of Ohio, but for the past quarter of a century has been a resident of this city. He was an assistant surgeon in the Union army during the civil war, and for a number of years held a position in the pension office. He was a member of the Grand Army of the Republic, and was actively identified with religious and charitable work.

For years he had served as member of the board of trustees of the Reform School. Dr. Carpenter leaves a widow, two daughters and three sons.
