Last Rites for the Dead

Funeral Services Over the Remains of John J. Carroll

Funeral services over the remains of John J. Carroll, who died early yesterday morning, at his home, 113 4th street southeast, will take place at the family residence Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Rev. Dr. John M. Schick will conduct the services. The burial will be in Congressional cemetery.

The deceased was born in New York in 1835. He had been in bad health for several months, although his condition during the past week was considered serious, his friends did not think the end was near. Early in life Mr. Carroll entered the grocery business in Troy, N.Y., and when the civil war began he enlisted at once in the federal army, and was given a commission as lieutenant in the 15th New York Regiment, Engineer Corps. At the close of the war Mr. Carroll came to this city and was appointed to a position in the government service, was employed in the pension office at the time of his death. He was a member of the Grand Army of the Republic, the Union Veteran Legion, and of the Masonic order. Two daughters, Miss Fannie E. Carroll and Mrs. Moses M. Swan, and several grandchildren survive him.
