Timothy Carroll Dies Here At 75

Retired Trade Commission Examiner Came to D.C. in 1898

Timothy A. Carroll, 75, retired examiner of the Federal Trade Commission, died Friday after a long illness at his home, 1329 Massachusetts avenue southeast.

A veteran of many years' Government service, Mr. Carroll came to Washington from Lynn, Mass., in 1898, when he obtained a position under Col. Carroll D. Wright, the first commissioner of labor. Mr. Carroll helped prepare statistics on which was based a congressional bill providing for literacy tests.

In 1904, he was transferred from the Bureau of Labor Statistics to the Bureau of Corporations, Department of Commerce, the predecessor of the Federal Trade Commission. During his later years with the commission, Mr. Carroll specialized in the study of petroleum and the petroleum products industry. He was reinterred in 1932.

Before coming to this city Mr. Carroll was connected with the shoe industry in Massachusetts.

Mr. Carroll took a prominent part in having introduced in Congress the bill setting aside a holiday for labor -- Labor day. At the first celebration of the day after the bill was passed, residents of Boston presented him an engraved watch, which he carried until his death.

He was graduated with bachelor and master of law degrees from Georgetown University.

For a number of years Mr. Carroll had been active in the Masonic organization. He was a member of LaFayette Lodge, F.A.A.M.; LaFayette Chapter Chapter, Royal Arch Masons; Washington Commandary, Knights Templar, and Almas Temple of the Shrine.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Eliza Carroll, and son, John H. Carroll, employe of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation.

Funeral services will be held at 10:30 a.m. tomorrow at his late residence. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery
