Walter F. Carter, 78, Succumbs on Returning From Reunion

Funeral services for Walter F. Carter, 78 years old, Confederate veteran who died of heart disease in Union station yesterday while returning from the Confederate reunion in Dallas, Tex., will be conducted at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon in Fifth Baptist Church, the Rev. J.C. Briggs officiating. Interment will be in Congressional cemetery.

After the civil war he came here and for many years was active in the fruit and vegetable produce trade in Center Market. For 10 years prior to the last January he was in the federal service. He made his home at 1624 Hobart street northwest with a daughter. Mrs. W.S. McDonald, and a son, Walter F. Carter, Jr. He also is survived by his other sons, Charles Taylor Carter, Dr. Emmet M. Carter, and Frank L. Carter and his daughters, Mrs. G.S. Colison, Mrs. H. McKinley and the Misses Belle N. and Maude V. Carter.
