Carvallo. Yesterday at her residence in this city after a brief illness, Madame Carvallo, the excellent and universally respected consort of Don Manuel Carvallo, the esteemed Minister of the Republic of Chile.

Letters of recent date from Santiago de Chili announce the appointment of Don Manuel Carvallo as Minister Plenipotentiary of that Government to the United States; and that he would, with his family, take passage at Valparaiso in the ship Hortensia, for Baltimore, to sail about the middle of March last, and may be expected here about the first of June.

Mr. Carvallo is very favorably known here, having made many friends on his former mission, which terminated some ten years ago on leave of absence. His amiable lady, one of our own country women, having enjoyed the kind attentions and marked civilities of the warm-hearted Chileans, now returns to us to partake of at least equal enjoyment in her own home. Their family and friends may be congratulated on the high gratification which their arrival will afford.
