Samuel R. Caswell, 87, who operated his own pastry and groceries shop here for 43 years, died yesterday at his home, 3106 Nineteenth street N.W.

Mr. Caswell, a native Washingtonian, attended public schools here before opening Caswell's Groceries at Fourth street and Pennsylvania avenue S.E. in 1905. He retired from the store in 1940 and went to work for J.E. Dyer Co., wholesale grocers, in Georgetown.

Mr. Caswell lived for more than 50 years at 405 Sixth street S.E. He served as a vestryman at Christ Church Washington Parish and was a member of the Masonic Naval Lodge.

He leaves his wife, Virginia, and a daughter, Mrs. Florence Manion, both of the home address; a son, Lambert, an insurance salesman, of 5948 First street, North Arlington, two grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Samuel R. Caswell, a native Washingtonian, who ran a fancy groceries and pastry store at 4th st. and Pennsylvania ave. se. for 43 years, died yesterday at his home, 3106 19th st. nw. He was 87.

Mr. Caswell opened Caswell's Grocery Store in 1905 after learning the trade at J.E. Dyer & Co. in Georgetown. He lived more than half a century at 405 6th st. se., and served many years as a vestryman at Christ Church Washington Parish.
