Death of Isaac P. Childs

Mr. Isaac P. Childs, senior member of the firm of the Childs Brick Co., died at his residence, 217 R street northeast yesterday afternoon. Thursday afternoon he was found in his buggy unconscious and was removed to his home, but never regained consciousness. He was born near Philadelphia 67 years ago and spent most of his life in brick manufacturing. He was a member of the I.O.O.F. and of the GAR. A widow, one son and four daughters survive him.
