Veteran Fireman Dead

Thomas Cissel, Aged 67, a Victim of Paralysis

Thomas Cissel died yesterday afternoon at his home in Twining City after a long illness. He had an attack of paralysis nearly three years ago and has been in failing health since that time. Funeral services will be held in the chapel at Congressional cemetery Friday afternoon at 3 o'clock.

Mr. Cissel was born in this city sixty-seven years ago. He was employed in the navy yard for a number of years, and while there became a member of the Anacostia Fire Engine Company. He was one of the first members of the Veteran Firemen's Association, and a delegation from that organization, as well as from Rawlins Post, G.A.R., will attend the funeral.
