Death of Justice J.T.C. Clark

Mr. John T.C. Clark, one of Washington's oldest citizens, died at noon today after a week's illness. He was taken with an attack of bowel trouble, from which he never recovered. He was attended by Dr. Sothoron. Deceased was nearly seventy-four years old. He was born in Georgetown. When a young man he learned the printing trade and worked on the National Intelligencer and Union and several other papers, and at the death of his father, the late John T. Clark, he was appointed his successor as justice of the peace, which office he has filled ever since, a one time serving as police magistrate. During recent years he occupied an office near the first precinct police station on 12th street. His death occurred at his boarding house, No. 1427 Ohio avenue. His body will be removed to the residence of his son, No. 2910 M street, from where his funeral will probably take place Sunday.
