### **An Old Citizen Gone**

Mr. Richard H. Clarke, who died on Saturday at his residence on 9th street between Massachusetts avenue and L street in his 73d year, was one of the old-time residents of the District. He was a son of Archibald Clarke, who, over a half a century ago, was a justice of the peace located on E street between 8th and 9th streets northwest. For many years the deceased was a printer on the old Union newspaper and subsequently he was a clerk in the Interior department, and for the past few years had prosecuted pension and other claims. He was in ante-bellum days prominent in the local democratic organizations of the District. He was a communicant of St. Patrick's Catholic church, from whence his funeral will take place on Wednesday.
