Falls Into River at Foot of 11th Street Southwest

Henry Clarvoe, a small boy, whose father, Henry Clarvoe, a painter, resides at 228 Linwood place southwest, fell overboard from the wharf at the foot of 11th street southwest this afternoon and was drowned. Fifteen minutes after the accident occurred the body was taken from the water and Dr. William Walter, who happened to be upon the wharf at the time, made an unsuccessful effort at resuscitation. When he decided there was no sign of life left in the body the superintendent of the morgue was summoned. He removed the remains to the morgue and held them until they were identified.
