Stricken While In Bed

Trained Nurse Succumbs Later to Apoplexy at Hospital

Mrs. Margaret Clem, fifty years of age, a trained nurse, died of apoplexy at 6:30 o'clock this morning at the Casualty Hospital, where she had been removed last night from her apartments, 114 C street northeast.

Mrs. Clem, who was a widow, retired at an early hour last night as she was feeling unwell. About 9 o'clock she was stricken with apoplexy. Miss M. Lane, another nurse in the house, went to her assistance, and a physician was called to attend her. It was then decided to remove her to the hospital. The ambulance was summoned and the woman was taken to that institution, where the physicians worked throughout the night in an effort to relieve her sufferings, but she died this morning.

Mrs. Clem is survived by one brother, who resides in Martinsburg, W. Va.

The funeral services will be held Monday afternoon at St. Mark's P.E. Church, 3d and A streets southeast. Rev. Dr. W.L. DeVries, rector of the church, will conduct the services. Interment will probably be made in Congressional Cemetery.
