Aged Baltimore Couple Buried in Congressional Cemetery

With a solemn high mass of requiem at St. Peter's Catholic church yesterday morning, funeral rites were held for Mr. and Mrs. Timothy Cohan, the aged couple who were found dying of monoxide gas poisoning in their home in Baltimore Friday afternoon. After the services, they were buried in the Congressional cemetery.

Oliva Mattingly, granddaughter of the couple, who discovered the bodies when she called at their comfortable old home in Baltimore was the chief mourner at the services. Since Friday night she has kept lonely vigil over the bodies in a local undertaking parlor, and not until the coffins were placed in their graves did she leave them.

Mrs. Mattingly explained yesterday afternoon after the funeral, that the couple, who had been her mainstay since her mother died and her father deserted her, were comfortably situated before death. She also denied the report that her father had mistreated her mother.
