Charles Conrad Dies

Employed 32 Years in Ordnance and Adjutant General's Office

Charles T. Conrad, son of the late Maj. F.A. and Elizabeth J. Conrad, a member of the Association of Oldest Inhabitants, died at his home, 623 6th street southwest, Saturday night, after an illness of more than a month. He was employed in the ordnance department of the Army and the adjutant general's office for thirty-two years.

Mr. Conrad was born in Philadelphia, Pa., January 5, 1856, and came to Washington when a small boy. He was at one time first sergeant of Company B, Washington Light Infantry, and won second prize in a national competitive drill in May 1886. He also captured many honors as a rifleman. Mr. Conrad was captain of Company B, Sons' of Veterans, and a member of the Knights of Malta and the Legion of Honor.

Surviving him are his wife, Mary Ellen Conrad, four daughters, Edith, Ann, May and Clara Conrad, and a son, Charles T. jr.; two sisters, Anna McClintock and Ella Beresford, a brother, F.W. Conrad, and two grandchildren, Albert Doyle and Edith Norton.

Funeral services will be held at the home of Mr. Conrad's son, 402 7th street northeast, at 2:30 o'clock tomorrow afternoon. Interment will be in Congressional cemetery.
