Sudden Death in East Washington

This morning at an early hour, Mr. Cooper, better known as Dr. Cooper for the last twelve years apothecary of the United States Marine Corps, stationed at headquarters in this city, was found dead at the barracks. He had been suffering severely for the last six weeks from consumption, which was undoubtedly the cause of his death; although last evening he said he felt better than he had felt during the past three weeks. The deceased, who was about forty years of age was generally esteemed by the members of the corps and leaves a wife and children. He was a brother-in-law of Mr. Roach, drum major, and the step father of Sergeant Halley, of the Marine band. His funeral will take place on Thursday next.
