Funeral Services Over the Remains of Mrs. Cross

The funeral of Mrs. W. Cross, who died very suddenly at an early hour yesterday morning from heart disease at the home of her father, Mr. James O'Neill, No. 1213 G street southeast, will take place tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Eleventh Street Methodist Episcopal Church. The services will be conducted by the pastor of the church, Rev. Mr. Cook, and the interment will be made in Congressional cemetery.

Mrs. Cross, who was but nineteen years old, and the wife of a machinist employed in the navy yard, had been in ill health for a long time, the result of chills, for which she was attended by Dr. James W. Herbert. The day preceding her death she, however, seemed to be much better than for several weeks, but about midnight she was attacked with heart trouble and died in a couple of hours. The mother of Mrs. Cross was completely prostrated by the shock, and this morning her condition was regarded as very critical.
