Engineer Drops Dead At Throttle of Train

James L. Crow, 61, Pennsylvania Railroad engineer, died yesterday at the throttle of his New York-Florida express train near Rahway, N.J., of a heart attack. The train came to an automatic stop when Mr. Crow relaxed his grasp on the throttle. A fireman brought the train back to the Rahway Station. It continued on to New York after a short delay.

Mr. Crow was born and educated in New Jersey, where he worked on his father's farm before coming to the District in 1910. He was an employe of the Pennsylvania Railroad for 35 years. He was a member of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers and an elder in the Gospel Chapel, Fourteenth street and Pennsylvania avenue S.E.

Survivors are his widow, Mrs. Dorris Hunt Crow; a daughter, Mrs. Alice Pfaff of Louisville, Ky.; a son, Lt. Wallace Crow of Washington, with the Army in France; two brothers, Irving and William Crow, both of Wilmington, Del., and a sister, Miss Martha Crow, also of Wilmington.

Funeral services will be held at 3 p.m. Monday at a place to be designated later. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.
