### **John H. DeAtley Dies At Home Here Was Member of Oldest Inhabitants and Proprietor of Pennsylvania Avenue Hotel**

John Henry DeAtley, 88, former proprietor of the old DeAtley Hotel on Pennsylvania avenue, died yesterday at his home, 637 G street southwest, after an illness extending over several years.

Mr. DeAtley established the old hotel, located on the south side of the Avenue between Twelfth and Thirteenth streets, the site of the new Post Office Department Building, in 1877, conducting it until 1917, when it was sold. Later it housed a grocery and rooming house, but had lost its identity with the DeAtley family.

He was a native of Westmoreland County, Va., and came to Washington as a youth of about 18 years. He was a member of the Association of Oldest Inhabitants of the District.

Besides his widow, Ms. Frances A. DeAtley, he is survived by two sons, LaMott and William, both of this city; four grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at his late home, at 2 p.m. tomorrow, followed by burial in Congressional Cemetery.
