Funeral of Peter G. Doyle

Services Held at Elks' New Home in Philadelphia

The funeral of Peter G. Doyle, who died at St. Joseph's Hospital last Friday, took place Tuesday morning in Philadelphia from the hall of Lodge No. 2, B.P.O. Elks, of which order the deceased was a life member. After the beautiful and impressive service held by the Elks there was a solemn requiem mass at 10 o'clock in St. John's Church, Rev. Wm. McLoughlan of St. Stephen's Church, Philadelphia, being the celebrant, with Father McNamara of Baltimore as deacon and Father Ryon of Norwood, Pa., as subdeacon. The remains were brought to Washington, D.C., where they were interred yesterday afternoon at 4:30 o'clock in Congressional cemetery. Rev. Ignatius Fealy of St. Joseph's Church, Washington, officiated at the grave. This was the first funeral from the Elks' new home in Philadelphia, and the first time that three priests, all members of the B.P.O.E., officiated at a mass for a departed

brother. Mr. Doyle was very highly regarded by all who knew him and was a faithful employe of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company for nearly forty years. The remains were accompanied by a guard of honor of four members of Philadelphia Lodge of Elks. There were many beautiful floral tributes both from Washington and Philadelphia.
