Dies of Injuries

Bevan Evans the Victim of Accident at Benning

Bevan Evans, 22 years old, of South Wales, England, an iron worker, was struck by a freight train at Benning, D.C., early this morning, and died in the Casualty Hospital as a result of injuries, at 8:15 o'clock. The coroner was at once notified of the death and will make an investigation today.

Evans came to this city to work in the construction of the new power house of the Potomac Electric Power Company, to be erected at Benning, and he had been employed there for several weeks, making his home at Mrs. Herbert's boarding house, near the water tank at Benning. He was a single man, and it is not believed he had any relatives in the city.

He was walking in the southbound yard of the Baltimore and Ohio railroad at Benning last night and was run down by a freight train. Some of the railroad workmen who witnessed the accident picked up and cared for the injured man, and Policeman Behrens of the ninth precinct was notified at once. The ambulance of the Casualty Hospital was called and he was conveyed there, as stated.

The body was removed to the morgue this morning to await investigation by the coroner.
