Long Illness Fatal To Henry M. Fry

Native of District Served for 20 Years as Joiner in Navy Yard

Henry M. Fry, 83, a native of Washington, who lived at 319 New Jersey avenue southeast, died yesterday at Casualty Hospital after a long illness. He had suffered a paralytic stroke six months ago.

For 20 years Mr. Fry was a joiner at the Navy Yard. When he retired in 1920 he was in charge of setting all machinery. Before his employment at the Navy Yard he was in the construction business.

Born and raised on Capitol Hill, Mr. Fry was a close student of civic and national affairs. An eyewitness to most of the presidential inaugurations, Mr. Fry as a small boy attended the inauguration of President Lincoln and squirmed his way to a position where he was photographed near the President.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow at the Charles S. Zurhorst funeral home, 301 East Capitol street. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.

One son, Morton Fry, survives.
