## Harvey Given, 72, Lawyer, Is Dead

## Former Assistant U.S. Attorney for District -- Funeral to Be Tomorrow

Harvey Given, 72, former Assistant United States Attorney for the District, died Saturday in Mount Alto Hospital after a short illness. Death was due to heart disease.

Mr. Given a brother of former Judge Ralph Given, for many years connected with the District Attorney's office, serving in several capacities. During the World War he was captain in the Army Intelligence Service.

Beginning work at the office of the district attorney many years ago, he later served there as chief clerk until 1915, when he was named special assistant to the United States attorney. He continued in this capacity until 1918 when he resigned to accept the Army commission.

In March 1924, he was named United States attorney and continued in that capacity until March of the following year. He had practice law since.

Mr. Given had become widely known also as a handwriting expert. A native of this city, he was the son of the late George H. and Isabella Given. He was a member of the Washington Lodge of Elks and the American Legion.

Private funeral services will be held tomorrow. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.
