Killed On Railroad At Flemington, N.J.

Flemington, N.J., Oct. 10 – Charles J. Golden, 22 years of age, of Keyser, W. Va., was killed this morning while riding on a Lehigh Valley freight train from Three Bridges to Flemington. He had been employed by the Kelly Company who are constructing a third track for the Lehigh Valley, and had just quit work. He was probably standing upon a box car and was struck by an overhead bridge. His body was cut in two by the train.

Flemington, October 12 – The funeral services of Charles J. Golden, who was killed near Three Bridges Thursday morning while riding on a Lehigh Valley freight train, was held last evening at Maple Lodge, the home of Mr. and Mrs. G.T.
