McGill Grove Dies, Retired Lieutenant of Metropolitan Police

Lt. McGill Grove, 81, a retired member of the Metropolitan Police Department, died at the home of his son, Detective Sergt. Walter E. Grove of the homicide squad, 1425 Thirty-third street N.W., yesterday.

A native of Washington County, Md., Lt. Grove came to the District as a boy. He joined the police force in 1897, being assigned to No. 8 precinct. He retired in July, 1941.

Lt. Grove was first assigned as a bicycle policeman. He later became a mounted officer. He was promoted to sergeant in 1919 and to lieutenant a year later. He received 13 commendations during his service.

He served under nine superintendents during his 44 years on the force, and was a member of the White House detail during World War I.

Lt. Grove is survived by his widow and son, a brother, John H. Grove, and a sister, Mrs. Mina Grove Mattingly, both of Washington.

Funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. Monday at St. Luke's Methodist Church, Thirty-fifth street and Wisconsin avenue N.W. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.
