
Kangi-Duta

(- 12 Dec 1867)

Wahpeton, Sioux Indian. Born Mendota, Minnesota; Died Washington, D.C. Served as a scout for the United States during the Dakota (Sioux) Uprising (August to



September, 1862). Member of Dakota delegation to negotiate a treaty with the Government. He was kidnapped (presumably for ransom) and murdered while in Washington, D.C. He was buried in Congressional Cemetery at government expense and Senate bill S. 584, 64th Congress, 1st Session (No. 140), Feb. 12, 1916, provided a headstone for the grave "In recognition of the valuable service rendered by this Indian and the friendship he bore toward the government."
