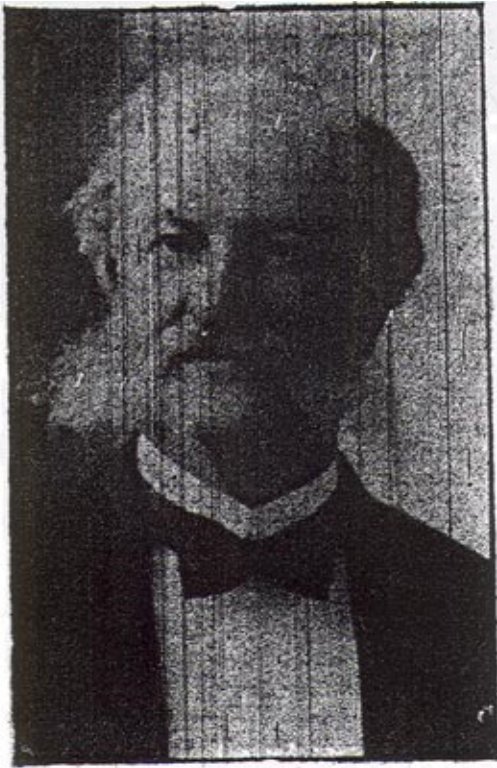

Andrew W. Kelley, 33d Degree Mason, Is Dead Head of Commission Firm Here Had Been in Business in City Since 1865

Andrew W. Kelley who has been in business in this city since 1865, died Saturday at his home, 2622 University place. Mr. Kelley was head of the firm of Kelley & Chamberlain, commission merchants of 911 Louisiana avenue. He was a prominent Mason, a member of New Jerusalem Lodge, No. 9, F.A.A.M., and a charter member of DeMolay Mounted Commandery No. 4, K.T. For a quarter of a century he had been a Scottish Rite Mason of the 33d degree, honorary.

Funeral services will be held at Immanuel Baptist Church, 1501 Columbia road, tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock. Interment will be in Congressional

Mr. Kelley's will was filed for probate today. He leaves a one-third interest in the business to Francis I. Brooks a "Faithful employee for many years." A bequest of \$200 is made to Annie Clowe, and the remaining estate is left to his daughter, Adele E. Kelley, who is also to act as executrix.
