Owner of Theaters On Eastern Shore

Frederick B. Klein, 59, Maryland theater owner, died Monday at Suburban Hospital. He had been ill since April.

Mr. Klein, of 10608 St. Paul street, Kensington, was born in Pittsburgh and came to the Washington area in 1918.

He was first manager of Loew's Columbia Theater. He joined 20th Century Fox as a salesman in 1929. Mr. Klein left the motion picture concern in 1949 when he bought the Church Hill Theater, at Church Hill on the Eastern Shore, and the Chester Theater, at Chestertown.

Mr. Klein was a member of the Variety Club here since 1942 and served since in 1949 on its board of governors.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Dorothy V. Klein; five sons, Herman W. Klein, 9620 Sligo Creek parkway, Silver Spring; Frederick B. Klein, jr., of the home address; Robert W.
