## Long Illness Fatal To E.W.C. Krieger

## Former Navy Yard Employe Was Active Member of Masonic Bodies

Edward W.C. Krieger, formerly employed at the navy yard and an active member of Masonic bodies here, died Tuesday at his Summer home, Charmalyn-on-the-Bay, Fairhaven, Md., after a long illness. He was 52 years old and had been a resident of Washington more than 30 years. His Washington home was at 214 Massachusetts avenue northeast.

Funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. Saturday, at St. Mark's Episcopal Church, Third and E streets southeast. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery with Masonic rites.

Krieger, who came to this city from Baltimore as a young man to work in the navy yard, was a champion bowler in the District about 20 years ago. He was a member of Columbia Lodge No. 3, F.A.A.M., and a past patron of St. Johns Lodge Chapter, No. 18, O.E.S.
