Howard Leapley, Long Here, Dies

Plastering Contractor, 52, Was Prominent in Masonic and Civic Circles

Howard C. Leapley, 52 of 340 Eleventh street southeast, for many years engaged in the plastering and concrete contracting business here, died Wednesday in Providence Hospital. He had been ailing several months, but had been seriously ill only a short while.

Although born in Maryland, Mr. Leapley had been a resident of Southeast Washington since early childhood. He was active in several organizations and widely known in business circles.

Mr. Leapley was a Scottish Rite Mason a member of Columbia Lodge, F.A.A.M., and Almas Temple of the Mystic Shrine. He also was a member of the Southeast Business Men's Association and the Washington Board of Trade. Active in charity work, Mr. Leapley long had been identified with the activities of the German Orphan Home in Anacostia.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Lottie M. Leapley; a son, Charles W. Leapley; three brothers, Harry T., Fred F. and Lawrence Leapley, and a sister, Mrs. Crystal Weimer, all of this city.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow at the residence. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.
