Miss Jessie MacBride, Music Critic, Native of Capital, Dies Served on Three Papers; Was Graduated From Corcoran Art School

Miss Jessie MacBride, a native of Washington, known here for many years in residential and newspaper circles, died last night at Emergency Hospital as a result of complications following an operation.

Daughter of the late William C. MacBride, former newspaper man of the Cincinnati Inquirer, Miss MacBride was long a staff member of the Washinugton Post and the old Washignton Times, where she specialized in music and art. Later she joined the Washington Times-Herald. At the time of her death she was employed in Government service in the education section of the Public Works Administration.

Miss MacBride's mother was the late Ellen Virginia MacBride, a native Washingtonian and a member of one of the District's oldest families.

Miss MacBride was a graduate of Washington schools and studied at the Corcoran Art School. She studied music under the late J.W. Bischoff. She was a charter member of the National Women's Press Club and a member of the Newspaper Club of Washington. At the time of her death she was living at the Marlboro Apartments.

Nearest surviving relatives are an aunt, Mrs. Douglass G. Miller, and two cousins, Mrs. Eileen Miller Burns and Neville D. Miller, all of Washington.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow at the Gawler funeral home, 1756 Pennsylvania avenue NW. The Rev. Harry D. Porter of Westminster Presbyterian Church will preach, and Miss Charlotte Klein, a friend of Miss MacBride's will be organist.
