#### **Official of Order of Rechabites Was Wife of Retired Capital Contractor**

Mrs. Sarah E. Mahoney, 69, assistant high secretary of the Independent Order of Rechabites, who died Tuesday night at her home, 333 C street southeast, will be buried today in Congressional Cemetery. Funeral services are being held this afternoon in Ryan's funeral home, 317 Pennsylvania avenue southeast.

Mrs. Mahoney was the wife of John R. Mahoney, retired paper hanging and decorating contractor, who has been high secretary of the Rechabites for more than 20 years. Mr. Mahoney also has been financial secretary of the Association of Oldest Inhabitants of the District of Columbia for many years.

Besides being assistant high secretary of the national Rechabites' organization about 10 years, Mrs. Mahoney for about 17 years had been financial secretary of Eagle Tent, No. 2, of the Rechabites.

A native of Baltimore she was the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. William Lovell. Her husband is the only immediate surviving relative.
