Patrick R. Mallon Dead

Succumbs to Second Heart Stroke Since Last August

Following a brief illness, Patrick R. Mallon, formerly of North Evans, N.Y., died yesterday at his residence, 431 New Jersey avenue southeast.

Mr. Mallon suffered a heart attack last August, from which he was unable wholly to recover, and a second attack, ten days ago, resulted in his death yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Mallon was born near Toronto, Canada, in 1837, removing at an early age to Buffalo, N.Y., where his father and brothers engaged in business. In 1856 the family removed to North Evans, and in 1868 Mr. Mallon was married to Miss Carrie L. Morsman, daughter of William H. Morsman, of the Poplars.

Mr. Mallon was actively interested in politics, and took a prominent part in the presidential campaign of 1888. In 1891 he removed with his family to Washington.

He is survived by his wife and two daughters, Mrs. Charles Dennison Oothoudt, of Detroit, Mich., and Miss Winifred Mallon, of this city, and by his sister, Miss Mary Mallon, of Buffalo, N.Y.
